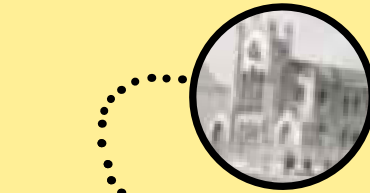
WHEN IT WAS BUILT IN 1840:

1840 New church and school is built

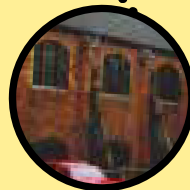


1876 The church is too small - need a new one in Lincoln
